#### **Registering A Domain Name**

It is time for us to re-register our domain name. Who is cheap?? Is it easy to transfer from one registration service to another?

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It depends on the level of privacy you want/need. An unlisted registration will keep the general public from knowing who owns the domain which might be helpful in certain situations. But if you're registering a domain for your firm website then there's no real benefit in making it private. All of your contact information will be on the domain's website anyway. If you go the non-private route, I highly recommend that you use a throwaway email address for the contact info rather than an email address you rely on every day - you will get a lot of spam to the email address on file with GoDaddy (or any other registrar for that matter). Hope that helps,
