I need to replace the drum unit on my printer soon (Brother MFC-7860DW). I looked online and the price difference between the Brother brand and the non-brand units was at least \$50 (about \$90 vs. \$30 respectively). That's a pretty big difference, so I thought I'd ask:

Do any of you use non-brand printer parts? And, while we're at it, toner/ink? Have you found any difference in quality?

Look to see if there's a company that 'recharges' OEM drums. If you can find one, the drum is going to work better because it's made for that equipment and the price is lower because you're not buying a new drum every time - just filing with new toner.

I've heard anecdotal evidence that refilled toner cartridges are worth it for the cheaper cost. Unfortunately, my own experience is that they are not. I've tried them twice, and the first time, I had to run out to Office Depot at 9pm the night before something was due when the refilled cartridge declined to work at all. Fortunately, I found out it was useless just before OD closed rather than just after. The second one, from a different source (Cartridge World), worked, but didn't last very long. It was probably no cheaper per page than the OEM.

For things like drums, I've had better luck with OEM units. I've come to the conclusion that drums are replaced so rarely, that an extra few bucks amortized over the life of the part really isn't a big deal.

OTOH, I regularly use generic toner cartridges, and have generally had very good luck. I buy mine from www.123inkjets.com and/or www.ldproducts.com. They are owned by the same company, but inexplicably sometimes they have different pricing. Good customer service. I once had a bad cartridge out of the box, and they expedited a new one to me along with a return shipping label. I've also had good luck with ink cartridges from www.compandsave.com.
