Postage Question for Those Doing Virtual Work

I use Endicia for my office postage. I just picked up some contract work for another attorney. It will probably be about 10 hours or so per week.

I will occasionally mail things from my office. I would like to segregate the postage that I use for him from my own.

I have the standard version of Endicia. Apparently I will need to upgrade my account with them to set up multiple profiles, for an extra \$25.00 per month. I'm not going to spend that just for this.

So clearly I need a secondary provider for this. I don't have time to hunt around. What is the cheapest service I can find for something like this?

The only thing I want to do is to be able to print postage directly on the envelopes. I won't need to use labels.

I use stamps.com. I can assign my office's matter numbers to track postage. But we also go ahead and enter any extraordinary postage costs in our billing program at the same time. I don't charge for postage unless it is more than \$2 or I'm sending a letter to a dozen beneficiaries of an estate. Just not worth it.
