Check in the paragraph tab (open the triangle in the corner to bring up the paragraph settings window) - look on the advance tab (second tab up to) and make sure that the "keep lines together" is not checked and maybe that the "keep with next" tab is not checked.

In the line spacing button, make sure that there is no extra space before and/or after the paragraphs.

BTW - all this is from memory - I might have some details a little off.

In the Word Home, Fonts, toward the right there is an eraser icon.

It will remove formatting.

Block, say, the page where you have the issue and click on the remove formatting icon, and, as they say, see what happens.
